In 2017, the Marketplace enrolled more than 178,000 Coloradans in private health insurance. 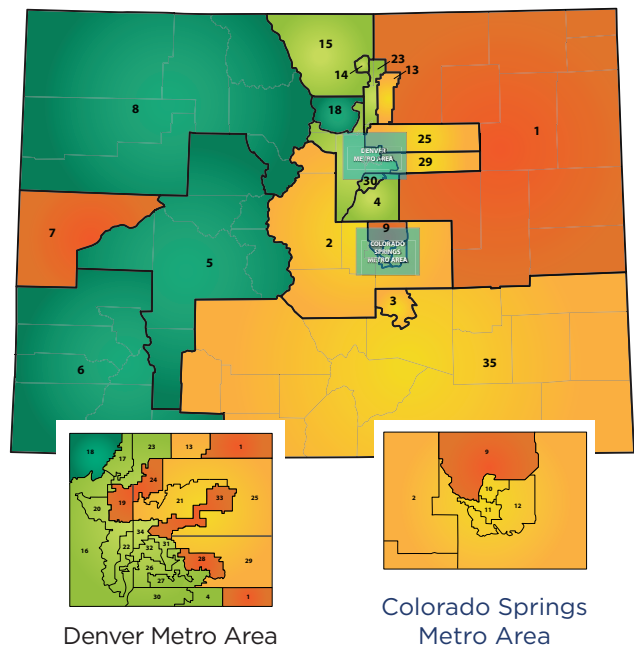
Number of Coloradans Enrolled in Private Insurance through Connect for Health Colorado by State Senate District as of June, 2017

Statewide numbers:

- > 10%: Marketplace customers from rural counties, which make up 8% of the state's population
- > 18%: Customers 26-34 years old
- > 290: number of Certified Application Counselors providing in-person assistance.
- > 110: Number of Health Coverage Guides providing statewide, in person assistance.
- > 961: Number of Certified and licensed Brokers.

Access

The fourth Open Enrollment Period saw more residents choosing health insurance coverage through our Marketplace than ever before. Overall, the number of Coloradans enrolling in medical coverage through the state Marketplace increased 7 percent over the number a year earlier.

Affordability

Sixty-one percent (61%) of Marketplace customers receive financial assistance (Advance Premium Tax Credits) to help lower the cost of their monthly premiums. The average state-wide tax credit for Coloradans is \$369.00. The table below shows the average tax credit in your District.

For the 2017 plan year, individuals and families were offered up to 132 different plans from 7 different health insurance companies. The number of plans and the insurance companies varies depending on where you live in the state. Connect for Health Colorado is a public, non-profit entity established in law by the Colorado General Assembly in 2011 to create a health insurance Marketplace. It opened for business on Oct. 1, 2013, for individuals, families and small employers to compare and buy health insurance and apply for tax credits to help make their insurance more affordable. Customers can shop online; get help by phone or chat from expert Customer Service Center representatives; and find in-person assistance from certified brokers and agents, community based certified Health Coverage Guides or Certified Application Counselors.
